This week – Conversion can happen at any age - none too young or too old!

When I consider Thy heavens, the work of Thy fingers...what is man, that Thou art mindful of him? Psalm 8 v3-4

Important Thought for us Today: Can a child be saved? Yes! The Lord's rebuke to his disciples in turning the children away shows that children are very important to God and can be saved. His surprising teaching is that although an adult and child are saved in the same way, the adult is the one that has to become like a child to be saved! (Mark 10v15). Once an adult or child realises their sinfulness and responds in repentance and faith, they can and will be saved, regardless of age. Biblical examples of children being saved are Timothy, who knew the scripture from a child (2 Timothy 2.15); Samuel who responded to God's call whilst young; and David, whose testimony is outlined in today's lesson. Will we seek the Lord, now, while we are young?

How the Difference in David Came About - His Conversion

- The stepping stones of Conversion
- \circ $\;$ Each conversion is unique and personal but follows the same important steps.
 - Fear (respect) of God Creator, Sovereign, Holy, Saviour, and Eternal.
 - Acknowledgement of Our Own Sin Before God and heartfelt repentance
 - Trust and Faith in God alone for Forgiveness, and Eternal Blessing.
- Where in the Bible is David's conversion?
- David is introduced as a believer when Samuel anoints him King (1 Samuel 13.14)
- \circ $\;$ His conversion as a young lad can be traced through his writings in the Psalms.
- David wrote many Psalms which detail his conversion experience.
- Psalm 19v1. 'The heavens declare the glory of God.'
 - David sincerely believed there must be a Creator God.
- Psalm 14v1. 'The fool hath said in his heart, "There is no God.""
 - David knew how foolish it is to say, 'There is no God '.
- Psalm 8v3,4. *'When I consider the heavens ... what is man that Thou art mindful of him?'* David is humbled before God the Creator.
 - David sees his insignificance compared to the night sky.
- Psalm 139v7-12 'Thou art everywhere. There is nowhere to hide'.
 - David knew that he could not hide his sin from an all seeing God.
- Psalm 32v5. 'I acknowledged my sin unto Thee ... and Thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin.'
 - David's conversion His heartfelt repentance and forgiveness.
- Psalm 103v12. 'As far as the east is from the west, so far hath He removed our transgressions from us.
 - David knew his sins were completely forgotten by God.
- Psalm 40v2. '*He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet on a Rock and established my goings.*'
 - David knew the dangerous pit of sin and the Rock, his Saviour.
- Psalm 23. 'The LORD is my Shepherd, I shall not want.'
 - David knew the Lord as Shepherd, Guide, Protector, and Saviour.
- Psalm 27v4. 'That I may dwell in the House of The LORD all my days.'
 - David's desire was to praise the LORD, now and for all eternity.
