Bible Class Notes - Studies in Matthew - Lesson 134 The Saviour Comes and Begins His Work

This week – The Lord Jesus Christ shows miraculous ability to heal our physical and spiritual ills.

Behold, there came a leper and worshipped Him, saying, "Lord, if Thou wilt,

Thou canst make me clean." Matthew 8v2

Important Lesson for us Today. God shows His compassion. We remind ourselves that the scriptures teach us that God is perfectly holy and that He has a holy hatred for sin. He must judge our sin; and no sinner can enter Heaven with their sin. The Bible also teaches us of His compassionate heart - that He has love and mercy toward lost sinners. He has demonstrated His love to sinners by sending His own Son, Jesus Christ, to bear away the guilt of our sin on the cross. The Lord Jesus willingly, and compassionately, took upon Himself God's Eternal wrath; Eternal punishment which should rightly fall to us. His death was fully sufficient to reconcile us to God, (bring us to peace with God). God the Holy Spirit works in the sinner's soul to give them faith to believe, bringing them to repentance and obedience. There cannot be greater love and compassion than this! What is our response? Will we live ignoring it? OR will we respond to His gracious call?

The Lord Jesus Heals A Leper.

- o **Leprosy** A Fatal Disease; Very common when the Lord lived on earth.
 - Infectious Easily caught from others through touching and close contact.
 - **Disfiguring** Flesh eaten away; loss of feeling; hands and feet easily burnt.
 - A Slow Death Deteriorating over many years. Warning, 'Unclean, Keep away'.
- The Lord used it as a picture to show us the deadly threat of sin in our lives.
- In God's sight our sinful hearts are fatally unclean, infectious, disfiguring.

 Our Sin Lies, deceit, pride, love of self, bad-temper, hateful, disobedient, lust, taking from God, rebellious, ignoring God in unbelief. A critical, unthankful spirit.
- One Difference Sin is within us from birth; we inherit our sinful nature from Adam. Our sin is catching, one sin quickly leads to another, getting worse the longer we live. We need to be saved from our sin before it drags us down to Hell, under God's wrath.
- o Let Us Consider The Leper And How He Approached The Lord:
- 1. He Came Why? He saw his great need; his horrible and helpless position. Have you seen a need to come to Jesus Christ? He is the only One who can heal us.
- 2. He Worshipped Having heard the Lord's teaching and, seeing His powerful and miraculous healings, he knew and believed that Jesus was Eternal God. Have you worshipped Jesus Christ? Do you see Him as Almighty God, your Creator? Do you believe He died to save you, and thank Him for His death for your sin on Calvary?
- 3. He Trusted He said, "If Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean." Matthew 8v2

 Have you trusted Jesus Christ? Do you believe He can save you from the guilt of your sin?

 The Leper felt unworthy, asking himself "Would God save a wretch like me?" So must we.
- **4.** He Was Healed The Lord touched him saying, "Be thou clean." Matthew 8v3 How simple, powerful, and wonderful! The Lord saves all who sincerely call out to Him. No one is too polluted or vile in their sin such that they cannot be forgiven and saved. Today, the miraculous work of God the Holy Spirit is to give us faith, change sinful hearts, causing us to hate our sin, turn from it in repentance, and live with obedient love to God. Have you repented your sin and been forgiven by Jesus Christ? Peace with God.

The Lord was willing to touch the unclean leper to heal him. He also forgave him. Likewise, He was willing to suffer the agony of crucifixion, and to take the wrath of His Father upon Himself, (the eternal wrath that we deserve), so as to save us. "He, (the Lord Jesus Christ), who knew no sin, became sin for us by taking our sin upon Himself (as if it were His own), that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him." 2 Corinthians 6v21 He takes our guilt away and gives us His righteousness. The Apostle John wrote, "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin."
