Important Lesson for us Today: Whose light are we relying on for salvation?

On a dark night we would be foolish to go cycling without lights, relying on a friend to light the way for us. Anything could happen to separate us from their light and leave us in danger. **Yet**, so many rely on someone or something else for their hope of Salvation. Children can rely on the faith of their parents to get them to Heaven. Church goers can rely on their church attendance and good works to get them to heaven. Whilst others rely on their being born in a Christian country. The only reliance anyone can have is based on the examination of their own heart to see if they have seen their sin and have truly trusted in the Lord Jesus for forgiveness and been given His righteousness.

The Word of God To Me

- After such a promising start, King Joash was judged at death a failure and sinner by both man and God. King Joash only did that which was right in the sight of the Lord whilst godly Jehoiada lived. As soon as he died Joash's lack of spirituality was exposed and he saw nothing wrong in following wicked suggestions, even in the murder of Jehoiada's son, Zechariah. His sin was so great that his servants murdered him in his own bed.
- If we believe we are Christians, we must put ourselves to the test:

Test 1 – Do we Know the Lord Personally?

- Joash's knowledge of religion never touched his heart. It was insincere. He never saw himself a sinner who needed to be personally forgiven by God. **Have we seen the ugliness of sin in our hearts and pleaded for God's forgiveness?**

Test 2 – Do we Understand the Bible?

- Joash only obeyed the Bible because Jehoiada told him to. He never willingly read it. Once Jehoiada died he felt free to reject God's laws and live as he chose. **Is the Bible dull to us, or is it lovingly read and obeyed - our treasured guidebook?**

Test 3 – Do We Love Other Believers?

- Joash, with hatred in his heart, found it easy to murder Jehoiada's son. He also showed his preference for being with anyone but the Lord's people. **Who are we the happiest with? The Lord's people or anyone but a Christian?**

Test 4 – Do We Pray Real Prayers?

- Joash just read out prewritten prayers by Jehoiada. He read the prayers without thought for who he was addressing or the words he was saying. **Are our prayers from our heart, addressed to Almighty God, or just mechanical?**

Test 5 – Do We Feel the Attacks of Satan?

- Joash was left alone by Satan as he easily gave himself up to his sin. Only those who turn to the Lord are attacked with doubts, fears, and difficulties. **Take comfort if you are attacked, as Satan only worries those who are the Lord's.**

Test 6 – Have We Noticed a Permanent Change in Our Souls?

- Joash was only godly when Jehoiada was alive. On his death he showed that he had no true love for God, or His standards. **A true Christian will still love and obey the Lord no matter what trials they face.**

It is very dangerous to pretend to be a Christian, just to please those around you. The most important Person to please is the Lord.

Examine yourself – Who do we live to please? Friends, parents, or Christ alone?

Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your salvation with fear and trembling. Philippians 2v12
