

Bible Class Notes - Studies on The Lord Jesus - Lesson 152

The Saviour - Welcomed

This week – We learn of The Saviour's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, on the foal of an ass.

**When Jesus reached Jerusalem the children
crying in the temple, and saying:
“Hosanna to the Son of David”
Matthew 21v15**

Important Lesson for us Today: What does Hosanna mean? It is a Hebrew word, *“Save now”*.

It is a word of worship with special recognition that Jesus Christ is God The Son, the promised Messiah and Saviour Who had come to save and rescue sinners from the guilt of their sin. God looks at the sincerity of our heart, to see if we have come humbly, in real faith and repentance. When we worship God and pray to Him, do we recognise He sent His Son to die for us on the cross? In our lesson today there were two types of people – one group who truly worshipped the Lord as the Promised Saviour, and others who were not sincere, caught up in the fickle euphoria of the day, who, in seven days' time, would shout, *“Crucify Him”*.

We must ask ourselves, *“Which group am I in?” “Is my worship acceptable, is it sincere?”*

EDT Bible/College Class Take Home Sheet

This sheet is given to remind you of the lesson and to encourage you to read your Bible.

The Saviour Welcomed – Into Jerusalem.

- **A Long-Expected Event For Jerusalem – Prophesied in the Old Testament.**
 - **The hill of Abraham's sacrifice, 2000BC.** Read Genesis 22v1-14. Mount Moriah, where faithful Abraham was told by God to sacrifice Isaac. The Lord provided a substitute for Isaac, a ram caught in thick thorns. A prophetic picture of Christ Who, 2000 years later, died for us on Calvary, on Mount Moriah.
 - **The site where David prepared to build the Temple, 1000BC.** Mount Moriah, Jerusalem, the site chosen by God for Solomon to build the Temple. **2 Chronicles 3v1.**
 - **The people prepared by Zechariah, 500BC.** Zechariah 9v9, Christ riding an ass.

The detailed fulfilment of these prophecies authenticates the Bible as The Word of God.

- **The Great Day of Christ's Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem Begins.**
 - **Humble, Lowly Transport** – An ass was requisitioned and gladly handed over.
 - **Carpeting of the Way** – Large crowds, including many children, threw their cloaks and palm leaves in the way, recognising Him as the Lord of Glory.
 - **A Genuine Welcome** – They cried out, *“Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest.”* Matthew 21v9

Conclusion No other king or ruler have had their entry into a city described in such detail hundreds of years before the event. **Who was this Jesus?** He is God the Son, The promised Messiah, The Lord of Glory Who came to be the Saviour of the world.

- **The Lord Jesus Visits The Temple in Jerusalem.**
 - **He Exposes the Temple Authorities** – The Lord, in holy anger, turns out those who were exorbitantly ripping off the poor people who came to sacrifice to God and worship Him. He said, *“My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves.”* Matthew 21v13. See also Isaiah 56v7.
 - **The Priests were Hostile** – The Lord had received the adoration and worship of the crowd, taught with authority, and had healed many who were sick. In hateful jealousy the Scribes and the Pharisees ask, *“By what authority doest Thou these things? and who gave Thee this authority?”* Matthew 21v23
 - **The Lord warns the Religious Leaders** – *“Woe unto you, hypocrites”* Matt 23v13.

Beware of many false teachers today who mix their false religion with the true Gospel.

- **The Lord Jesus' Sadness Over Jerusalem.**
 - **The Saviour Weeps** – Knowing that many who shouted, *“Hosanna”* today, would in a weeks' time, cry, *“Crucify Him”, “Crucify Him”*.
 - **His Gracious Compassion** – He longed to gather them under His protective wing, but they refused. *Are you resisting the Lord's gracious call to repent? “O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!”* Matthew 23v37
