Considering the vital importance of Christian character

This week we reminded ourselves about the **character** of Daniel, his friends, his enemies, Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar, and Nehemiah, his enemies and that of the Lord Jesus Christ.

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Important Lesson for us today: What is Sanctification? Sanctification is the lifelong process of a Christian believer growing more like the Lord Jesus Christ. We can only grow in sanctified Christian character if we know the Lord Jesus Christ as our Saviour, and we daily seek to obey Him as Lord. It is only when our sins are forgiven that we want to take Him as our supreme example of holiness, obedience, sincerity, humility, love, mercy, forgiveness, etc. being set apart from the evil world of sin around us. Read Galatians 5v22,23 – The Fruit of The Spirit.

This sheet is given to remind you of the lesson and to encourage you to read your Bible.

Christian Character. Note the following: -

- Daniel's loyalty to God and great courage, even when his life was in danger. From a young age he showed sincere faith, integrity and prayer; he refused to be lured into a sinful life in Babylon.

 He stood firm for his God, even though his life was threatened.

 For over 70 years his Christian character was trusted by the rulers of Babylon/Persia Nebuchadnezzar, Darius, and Cyrus.
- Daniel's friends Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego remained calm, trusting God to save them, even though they were thrown into the fiery furnace. The Lord preserved them, reminding us that He is able to save all who call upon Him in repentance and faith.
- Nehemiah was humble and sought God's forgiveness for his, and the peoples', sin. He showed concern for the glory and honour of the Name of the one true God, risking his life and working hard to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. He re-established worship in the Temple, and challenged the fickle people, (who kept falling into their old sins of idolatry), that they repent and return to the Lord.

Only in Christ can we emulate the character of Daniel, his friends, and Nehemiah.

 The Lord Jesus Christ is our great example – He demonstrated humility, love, mercy and grace in coming to earth from Heaven to die for lost sinners on Calvary. Hallelujah, what a Saviour!

Un-Christian Character. Note the following: -

- **Nebuchadnezzar was a proud man** setting himself up as the one to be worshipped, too proud to worship God. God humbled him.
- Belshazzar was also proud and defiant against God.
 He saw the 'Finger of God's Judgement' writing on the wall –
 "You are weighed in My balance of justice and are found wanting".
- Sanballat, Tobiah and Geshem were all wickedly set against God and Nehemiah by opposing the restoration of the walls and gates of Jerusalem. But their scheming and lying was no match for Nehemiah who obeyed and trusted God to protect and guide him.

Christian Character is to be Christ-like, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."
