'(At Ephesus) fear (respect towards God)
fell on them all, and the name of the
Lord Jesus was magnified. And many
that believed came, and confessed (their
sins to God)... 'Acts 19 v17,18.

Important Lesson for us today: Should we follow the crowd? OR should we have our own convictions and belief? – The crowd is usually wrong, so do not be influenced by the worldliness of this age. Today, the vast majority reject the truth about God and the way of forgiveness that He has provided. You may not worship a physical idol, but Satan tries to confuse us with man-made religion, even to worship a 'god' of our own imagination.

Paul Declares The Gospel of Jesus Christ to the Ephesians.

• Paul Arrives in Ephesus and Finds: -

- Ephesus another magnificent, prosperous city, but a proud city filled with superstitious worshippers of an idol who had 'blessed' their city - 'The Goddess Diana', believed by them to be 'an image which had fallen down to earth from Jupiter'.
- o A temple had been built in her honour, out of costly, beautiful white marble.
- o Every family had a silver image of her in their home afraid to live without it.
- They superstitiously paid large sums of money for 'magic scrolls' to ensure she would protect and help them against life's dangers sickness, earthquakes, etc.
- Even today many people are attracted to superstitious cults and false religions.

• Paul Preaches A New Message which is Blessed of God: -

- Paul preached the Gospel for 2 years 'all in Asia heard, both Jew and Greek'.
- o Many believed and were converted trusting alone in Jesus Christ as Saviour.
- But there was much opposition encouraged by Demetrius, a silversmith.
- Caused a Riot 'Great is Diana of the Ephesians' was chanted for two hours.

• The Changed Practices of Those Who Were Converted: -

- These Now Sincerely Believed The Gospel of The Lord Jesus Christ.
- They immediately stopped believing the foolish tales about the lifeless idol Diana.
- Now they believed and worshipped the One True God, Creator of Heaven, and Earth.
- Trusting in Jesus Christ Who, as perfect Man, had died for their sin and risen again.
- They Confessed Their Evil Ways To God and To Each Other.
- They confessed their sins in detail to God in repentant prayer, asking for forgiveness.
- They Burned Their Books and Destroyed Their Silver Idols of Diana.
- In doing this they showed their fidelity to God trusting Him wholeheartedly.
- All the past errors were disposed of, put behind them, even at great personal cost.

Becoming a Christian Means: -

- We sincerely ask The Lord to be our Saviour and Lord, believing He died for us.
- We stop believing wrong ideas that we are good enough to enter Heaven without repentance and forgiveness; that we can live successfully without God.
- We acknowledge our heart sins to God (our pride, selfishness, unclean thoughts, anger, disobedience, lies, stealing, covetousness) - repent of them, seeking God's help to hate them, and to resist when we are tempted to fall back into them.
- We leave off all foolish superstitious notions of religion and 'idol' worship.
- We stop looking to this world's entertainments for our joy and happiness.
- We seek to worship God, serve Him obediently attending church, being Baptised.

Paul later wrote to the Ephesians, "As the truth is in Jesus ... Put off the 'old man' (old way of life) ... Put on the 'new man', (the likeness of Christ), which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness".
