Important Thought for us Today: Do You Make New Year Resolutions? Have you managed to keep them? We must admit that we fail to keep them because we have made them in our own strength, and very soon they lapse and are broken. It is good to be resolved to do the right thing, but we need the resolve of faith to keep our promise to God to be a Christian. Faith is the gracious gift of God, (Ephesians 2v8). This is the work of God The Holy Spirit, (Ephesians 2v1). It is He Who quickens us, (to bring us alive to God through the New Birth), such that we can be resolved to hate our sin, turn from it, and repent: believing in the Saviour Who died on Calvary as our substitute. It is this gift of faith from God which causes us to take note of Christ calling us to seek and find Him and which enables us to exercise it to truly repent our sin and be saved.

- We Live in The Limits of Time. God Lives Without Limits in Eternity.
- \circ $\,$ Time started at Creation. It will end at the Lord's return Judgement Day.
- Events in time vary Queen Elizabeth II reigned 70 years and 214 days.
 Liz Truss recently lasted as UK's Prime Minister for less than 50 days.
 The Titanic, (largest ship afloat at the time), sank 8 days after completion.
- What is in a name? Why is the Lord called Alpha and Omega?
- $\circ~$ Alpha is the first letter of the Greek Alphabet and Omega is the last.
- These Names tell us that the Lord always was, is now, and always will be. He is the beginning and ending, the first and last. Jesus is eternal God. Genesis 1v1, "In the beginning God." John 1v1, "In the beginning was the Word." Psalm 90v2, "from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God." Eternally God.
- \circ $\;$ There was never a time before the Lord God existed. He always has been.
- Coming First. Jesus Christ Must Be Our Alpha First in our lives.
- $_{\odot}$ $\,$ We like to come first to win, to get the best marks, for our team to win.
- o Christ is the **Cornerstone** of our Salvation. Acts 4v11. Promised from eternity.

So, we must remember to put the Lord first in all things. He is Alpha and Omega.

- From Cover to Cover, From Beginning to End, and Everything In-between.
- The Lord Jesus Christ has many names. He is mentioned in every book of the Bible. In Genesis 3 - the Promised Seed. In Genesis 4 - pictured by Abel's lamb sacrifice. In Genesis 6 - pictured by Noah's ark. In Exodus 12 as The Passover Lamb saving the Israelites. We are slaves to our sin; we need a Saviour to save us from it. In John 1v29 we hear John the Baptist preaching, "Behold, The Lamb of God" coming to save sinners, and God declaring Him to be His Eternal Son. In Revelation 20v15 we hear of The Lord as The Lamb and of His Book of Life.
- Almighty To Save. God has infinite power over life and death Rev1v18
- He gives us our living soul in the womb, our first breath at birth, and watches over us until we die. He wants us to have fulness of life in our souls - the joy of knowing His power to forgive our sin. We live in time, but we must prepare for eternity.
- The Ending. Not Sad, Quite the Opposite A Successful Saviour.
- On the cross the Lord triumphed over sin and death, purchasing eternal life for all believers. It was His plan to die on the cross and rise again. He said, *"I am He that liveth, and was dead; and behold, I am alive for evermore."* Revelation 1.18.
- The ending on the cross is where we begin if we come as sinners to Jesus. Having successfully accomplished His earthly mission, the Lord is now back at the right hand of the Father reigning for ever. The Lord will return to take believers who have sincerely repented to a new eternal Heaven and Earth.
