This week – God has made many wonderful promises to us in The Bible. Do we believe them?

For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Christ our Lord. Romans 6v23.

But God is Holy and He also promises to Judge everyone who reject His offer of mercy.

- "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ." 2 Corinthians 5v10.
- "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment." Hebrews 9v27.

Hymn 590 - Job, in all his troubles, could say, "I know my Redeemer liveth." Job 19v25.

 He lives, He lives, Who once was dead;
 He lives, my everlasting Head.
- 4. He lives, my kind, wise, constant Friend; Who still will keep me to the end; He lives, and while He lives I'll sing, Jesus, my Prophet, Priest, and King.

 He lives, eternally to save;
 He lives, all glorious in the sky;
 He lives, exalted there on high.

Revision – Lessons 119-125 - The Various Forms That Sin Can Take.

- o 119 Sin is Rejecting God. Elijah warned King Ahab and Jezebel.
- God is angry with all those who wilfully break His Holy and perfect Law.
- The Gospel is finding the way back to God from the dark paths of sin.

 We must humbly approach God through trusting in The Lord Jesus, the ONLY Saviour.
- o 120 Sin is playing with other gods. Idols those of our own making.
- God looks for sincerity and reverence in our worship, and obedience in our lives.
- The Gospel is leaving the world and its' evil ways and trusting in God alone. We are influenced today to think evil is good, and good is evil; to live as we please.
- o 121 Sin is Wounding The Conscience. Jezebel had Naboth murdered.
- God is fully aware of our motives. We have no secrets; nothing is hid from Him.
- The Gospel is facing up to our sin and seeking the Saviour to remove our guilt. We must honestly acknowledge our sin to God and pray for forgiveness and cleansing.
- 122 Sin is a Fatal Disease. Naaman obeyed God his leprosy was healed.
- God calls us to the foot of the cross where Jesus Christ died. We must.
- The Gospel is being healed and made new. New desires to live to please God. We must thank God for the Holy Spirit Who quickens with the gift of faith to repentance
- 123 Sin Brings Death. God gives Elisha the power to restore a boys' life.
- We are dead in sin. Only Christ's death on Calvary can restore us to spiritual life.
- The Gospel is receiving the gift of Christ's righteousness and Eternal Life.
 We inherit Adams' fallen nature; without Christ we are spiritually dead towards God.
- o 124 Sin is Going To War With God. The Syrians were against Elisha and God.
- God showed His mercy to the captured Syrians by feeding them; releasing them.
- The Gospel is accepting God's offer of mercy and peace, but only on His terms. Satan, the world, and sin are against us. We need God on our side to gain the victory.
- 125 Sin is Refusing To Believe God's Promises. Unbelief is a great sin.
 - God promises to forgive all who call on Him in repentance and faith.
- The Gospel is trusting God's Word of Truth, revealed to us In the Bible.

We do not deserve God's free mercy and grace. It is out of His love that He saves sinners

- Finally, Sin Leads to Hell. There is a Day of Judgement to Come.
- God is very fair with us. He has set His love upon His Elect People, to save them.
- The Gospel leads a forgiven sinner to Eternal Heaven.

God has promised judgement upon all unbelievers. Behold, now is the Day of Salvation.

For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us, even by me and Silvanus and Timotheus, was not yea and nay, but in Him was yea.
