How to silence the conscience - Matthew 27 v24 EDT Bible Class and College Class - 20.04.25

Introduction

- Good Friday morning, crowd gathering, news spreading, Christ arrested in night! Tried! Guilty!
- Infectious excitement. Hasn't turned out as they hoped. No deliverance from Romans.
- Verdict given but problem. No authority to punish. Only Romans. So, to Pilate.

Who was Pilate?

- Roman governor of Judea under Emperor Tiberius from roughly AD 26–36.
- Maintain order and oversee Roman interests, including tax collection and judicial matters
- Insensitive to Jewish religious customs, provoking tensions, e.g. using temple funds to build an aqueduct
- Sees through Jewish leaders envy.
- Questions Christ, impressed, innocent.
- Wife uneasy.
- Decides to release Christ but how without incurring anger of Jews?
- Plan, Barabbas, but people persuaded otherwise.
- Complete rejection as prophesied.
- What evil has he done? Crucify Him.
- Riot brewing.
- Had all power, soldiers, authority, but coward, feared crowd.
- Also loved position, meant to be keeping peace, if riot, word will get back to Caesar, lose job, even his life.

- Fear of Caesar greater than fear of God.
 You may be afraid to believe Christ is the Saviour.
 You may fear what your friends will say and act.
 Does this keep you from bowing before Christ?
- Jesus was Sacrificed justice to pacify Jews.
- Wanted to do good but lacked the strength.
 Pilate could find no fault in Christ.
 But washed his hands and sent Him to be crucified.
 Fallen human nature all of us.

The conscience

- Then read key verse washed hands. Matthew 27v24 When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing, but that rather a tumult was made, he took water, and washed his hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: see ye to it.
- Why? Symbolic. Not guilty, passing guilt to Jews.
- Trying to silence his conscience
- What is the conscience?
- Can't be seen by a doctor, it is a spiritual capacity
- God-given, moral awareness, God's law written in our hearts
- 'Policeman' of the soul
- Warns and allows, condemns and acquits
- Our conscience is precious, do you use it?
- For many, an irritation, we want to quash it

How people try to silence their conscience

1. Ignore it

- an alarm, background noise, annoying, blocked out, hardly aware of it
- drown it out, fill up our thoughts and time, never consider

2. Comparing with others

- Yes, I'm a sinner, but look at what they've done!
- I'm not so bad but God's perfect standards

3. Pass responsibility

- he started it
- it wasn't just me
- Or, like Pilate, not doing anything
- sins of omission

4. Sear it

- do worse and worse sins, more extreme
- begin not to feel bad about 'small' sins any more
- like a hot iron searing you that patch of skin is hardened to pain, doesn't feel pinpricks any more
- leprosy is a good example patient losing pain

5. Reprogram it

- Atheism doing this in society today
- Change good to bad and vice versa
- Rejection of Holy standards of an unchanging God
- Morality not defined by us

How can guilt be removed?

- Has your conscience spoken to you? Felt your guilt?
- None of the above methods silence the conscience
- Subdue it for a time, corrupt it, desensitise it, but it will not go away

- Criminals turning themselves in after many years, why?
- Each of us, sin record, video recording, but it cannot be wiped out
- Conscience speaking, great blessing, God warning you of judgement
- Face God, give account, witness is your conscience
- Burden of guilt? Unease? How to remove?
- Only one God-given way
- Substitutionary atonement, sufferings, of Christ on Calvary
- Go to Christ, He alone can wipe our record clean, take away guilt, forgive
- How do we go? Prayer: praise, repent, plead, trust
- Will He hear? Yes,

Pilate responsible, but Christ went willingly, great love

- What will you do with Christ?

Must do something? Pilate: crown Him or crucify Him. What is your response?
