# **Gains and Losses In Following Jesus**

"Yes, Lord, Thou knowest that I love Thee."
John 21v16.

Important Thought for us Today: What is Love? God does not just love, He is Love! It is not merely one of His attributes, it is His very nature! The greatest demonstration of His love is God the Son dying to save lost, undeserving sinners, who only cause Him grief and sorrow. John 3 v16. What a blessing for us that God's love is eternal, gracious, unchanging, and uninfluenced. God has placed the capacity to love within the human soul allowing us to appreciate beautiful things and love each other. Yet our love easily turns to hate due to sin. We see this when a man and a woman, once so full of love, marry to become one, then fall out and seek divorce. The ultimate manifestation of human love is demonstrated at conversion when our souls respond in repentance and obedience because of the Saviour's love for us! The Lord says to us, "If you love Me keep My commandments". John 14 v15

# Gaining From Loss – Peter's Denial and Restoration.

- o The Lord warned His Disciples they would All Desert Him at His Arrest.
  - Bold Peter vehemently said, "I will not deny thee in any wise (way)."
- Peter's denial Cost himself and his Saviour much pain and sorrow by:
  - **Deserting Jesus** So soon after he had boldly promised to stay by His side.
  - Denying Knowing Jesus Even when challenged by a mere servant girl,
     he cursed and swore rather than acknowledging he was the Lord's disciple.
  - Weeping bitterly The cock crowed the 2nd time, as Jesus had predicted.
     Peter was so ashamed earlier he was so full of self-confidence, but now he had failed to keep his promise, deserted his Lord, and cowardly lied.
  - o Yet, through Christ's forgiving love, Peter gained spiritually by:
    - Learning a Great Lesson From now on he must, and would, fully trust Him as God; His Saviour Who knew him better than he knew himself!
    - **Discovering** that total dependence on the Lord was needed otherwise he would miserably fail, costing his Saviour much sorrow and grief.
    - Appreciating the Lord's undeserved kindness, love, and mercy.
       During His 'trial', the Lord looked at Peter with compassion.

      Luke 22v61.
    - Experiencing True Repentance He wept bitterly in true sorrow for his sin.
    - 'Tasting' Forgiveness Believing that Christ died to be punished for all his sin so that he could now be reconciled to his Saviour and Lord. 1 Peter 2v24. The Lord asked Peter three times "Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou Me?" Peter answered, "Lord ... Thou knowest that I love Thee." John 21v15-17. The Lord, knowing that he was sincerely repentant, said, "Feed My sheep".
  - $_{\circ}\,$  Once Humbled and Forgiven, Peter is greatly used of God:
    - Peter the Apostle became a great Christian leader. On the Day of Pentecost (the start of the New Testament Church), he preached Christ as the promised Saviour, with boldness, remaining faithful to God throughout his life, and was inspired by God to write Scripture - 1 & 2 Peter.
- We too can Gain Forgiveness and Help By Depending on the Saviour:
  - Too cowardly and ashamed of Jesus? Pray for His special strength and help.
  - Too confident in ourselves to follow the Lord? Pray for humility.

Come in humble repentance to the Lord Who lovingly receives and forgives.

The Apostle Peter wrote, "... because Christ also suffered for us ... Who His own self bare in His body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by Whose stripes ye are healed. For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop (Pastor) of your souls

1 Peter 2v21, 24-25.
