Bible/College Class Notes - Christmas 2025 The Joy of Knowing Christ as Our Saviour.

We read about the promise of the Saviour, Who came, died, rose again, and ascended.

"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder: and He shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God,

The everlasting Father,

The Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9v6.

Joy is a Christian experience of the soul: a 'Fruit of the Spirit', Galatians 5v22. Read the set readings and note who had this joy — Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, Elisabeth, Zacharias, the Wise Men, the Apostles, and all the faithful followers who witnessed the Lord's Crucifixion, His Resurrection and Ascension. Even Christ, anticipating His death to save sinners, had joy in His heart. Hebrews 12v2. So too must all who love the Lord Jesus as Saviour — the peace experienced over sin forgiven fills their soul with joy. May you have this experience of joy in your soul.

Bible Readings for the Next Two Weeks - December 21st and 28th 2025

(Choose a regular time each day to read the Bible and pray whether it be when you first wake up or just before you go to sleep)

Week 1 – A Saviour Promised, and the Wonderful Joy of that Promise Fulfilled.

Long before the Lord Jesus was born, the Old Testament prophets spoke of His coming. Micah 5v2 tells us He would be born in Bethlehem. Isaiah 7v14 tells us He would be born of a virgin. Isaiah 9v6 informs us of His wonderful names, and in Isaiah 40, God's people were told how to prepare for His coming. In the New Testament, The Gospels record details of His virgin birth, the faithfulness and joy of Mary and Joseph, of those who looked faithfully for His appearing, and how they all worshipped Him with joy in their hearts. They all, (including Mary), joyfully acknowledged that He was Emmanuel, 'God with us', the promised Saviour of lost sinners. Do you have the joy of personally knowing The Saviour, that your sins are forgiven bringing you eternal peace and reconciliation with God, and a place in Heaven for eternity?

Week 2 – More of the Wonderful Joy of the Promised Saviour Fulfilled.

The Wise Men worship Christ as a child. Christ is preserved from Herod. **Matthew 2.**At about 30 years of age, Christ begins His 3-year ministry, anticipating the 'Joy set before Him to die to save sinners', (Hebrews 12 v2). We note some significant events in Christ's sinless life. His intercessory prayer to The Father for His Elect People, (John 17), His substitutionary death on Calvary, (Matthew 27), His resurrection on the 3rd day, (Matthew 28), His ascension into Heaven, (Acts71v1-4), where He now intercedes for His People at the Throne of Grace, (Romans 8v26-34), and the Promise of His Return in Judgement at the end of time, (2 Peter 2v9). Only believers, who have repented, knowing that their sins are forgiven, have great joy and peace with God, and will experience Heaven's eternal blessing and joy.
