This week we consider the 8th of God's 10 Commandments

Thou shalt not steal.

Exodus 20v15.

Important Lesson for us Today: 'Thou shalt not steal'. We know that it is wrong to steal.

We do not like being stolen from, and we all know that we should not steal from others. But have you ever thought that we are guilty of stealing from God? We owe everything to God as the creator of our living soul, the giver and sustainer of our life. He commands, and deserves, our obedience, our worship, and our sincere repentance for our sin. Withholding these from Him is stealing from Him – it is breaking the 8th commandment. If we live to please ourselves, then we have stolen our lives from Him. Consider what He has done for us; the cost He paid when He suffered the wrath of His Father and died on the cross to save us from the guilt of all our sin. Consider the righteousness that He gives to us.

Does this not demand our allegiance, our love and respect for all His blessings to us?

The 10 Commandments – *God's Moral Law, His Rules for all time.*

God's 8th Commandment – "Thou Shalt Not Steal".

Stealing, taking to ourselves that which is not ours, is a grave sin which has many aspects. These include: -

● **Stealing from others: -**

- Taking to ourselves - Fraud, Cheating, Scrounging (expecting others to provide).
- Slandering another – Stealing their reputation; hateful character assassination.
- Stealing is unnecessary, selfish, greedy - showing our pride and arrogance.
 - Revealing that we have no care, respect, or love for those we steal from.
 - Always wanting more – Proudly saying, "I want it, so I will take it."
- We have all stolen something – we are all guilty before God's all-seeing eye.

● **Stealing from God: -**

- Adam and Eve both stole when they ate of the forbidden fruit. **Genesis 3v6.**
- Zacchaeus and Matthew were Tax Collectors who stole – but they paid it back.
- By stealing our lives, taking all our time to ourselves – leaving The Lord God out of our lives. Laziness is stealing time – Do not waste time in idle pursuits.
- By denying God of true worship - which He expects and deserves from us.
- By ignoring Him - stealing from the Honour and Glory due to His Holy Name.
- False Teachers steal truth from souls when they preach an false Gospel.

● **The Consequences for Stealing from God and others: -**

- **Now** - Loss of peace in the heart, no happiness or joy – a bad conscience, guilt.
- **Eternal** - God's deserved Judgement – Eternal, never ending punishment.

The Character of God is the very opposite. He is a gracious, loving, a giver.

● **God has given us so many gracious blessings: -**

- Our lives, bodies and eternal living souls. Joy and happiness in knowing Christ.
- Creation around us - its' pleasing beauty, providing all that we need to live.
- Our family, homes, love, security, comforts, friends, food, and clothes.
- The Lord Jesus Christ – A Saviour of thieves who repent. **Read Luke 23v42,43.**

In return, let us show gratitude to our God, praying for help to give to Him the praise, love, honour, glory, and time that He deserves. To give love and help to all around us.

● **The Graciousness and Mercy of God to Forgive Us Our Sin: -**

- **Now** - Restoration of peace, happiness and joy through repentance and faith.
- **Eternal** - God's undeserved salvation in Jesus Christ – Eternal, never ending.

We have all broken this commandment in so many ways. Let us sincerely repent.

God's free offer of forgiveness to each of us is, "Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn of Me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your soul."
